In the Semi Finals, West Adelaide beat St. Peters O.C. at Prospect Oval 10.12 to 8.14, while Prince Alfred O.C. beat Semaphore Central at Norwood Oval 16.13 to 15.14. In the Final at Thebarton Oval, Princes took another step towards emulating Saints' 1935 premiership success when it beat West Adelaide 9.8 to 7.17 after trailing for all but the last five minutes of the match. Waldeck starred at centre half back and Bennett and Stanford also played well for the Old Reds. The match was marred by fighting in the last quarter and general bad behaviour both on and off the field. West Adelaide then exercised its right of challenge, and aided by straight kicking for goal, denied Princes the opportunity of being only the second old collegiate team to win an A1 premiership. United won the match at Prospect Oval under umpire J.H. Parkinson 10.3 to 7.10, with skipper L.R. Brown, full back/full forward Ron Keane and ruckman Jim Bellhouse all prominent.

The match was played in a much better spirit than was the case the previous week, but again there was brawling amongst the spectators requiring police action, and the matter was brought before the Tribunal comprising F.S. Hone, S.H. Lewis and E. Millhouse. The matter was then referred to the General Committee which supported the recommendation of the Tribunal that A1 premiers West Adelaide United be expelled from the Amateur League because of the unacceptable behaviour of the Club's supporters as well as of some Club officials and players. President Massey stated that the behaviour of supporters was the responsibility of the clubs, a principle of which West Adelaide United officials had been advised when the Club joined the Amateur League. A report in the *Advertiser* on the 11th March 1938, quoted as follows from the Amateur League's annual report for 1937:
