CHAPTER THREE

In 1971, the first of Leighton's recall years as coach, (having combined as captain and early season coach in the 1951 premiership side) he set about reversing the slide which had spread during the late 60's. Miracles were not expected neither did they occur, but Leighton, with the players reacting to his zeal felt that the club was about to explode.

At the Annual Dinner, held at the Arkaba Hotel the following trophies for 1971 were awarded:—**Best and Fairest:** A's Grant Winkley, B's David Cubitt, C's Colin Dunsford, D's Tony Roark. **Most Consistent:** A's Ian Rudd, B's Russ Heywood-Smith, C's Ian Kohler, D's Mark Stevens. **Best Team Man:** A's Roy McEwin, B's Peter Jackson, C's John Gerard, D's Andrew Hayes. **Most Improved Player:** Craig Moffat. **Most Goals:** Garry Hugo. **Service to Club:** David Thomas.

In the following season 1972, everything fell into place — for the first and only time, two premiership flags were won. Secretary Rob Cornish saw it this way:—"It is with pleasure that I present the 44th annual report as the most successful in the club's history. At the completion of the final round, both the A3 and A3 reserve teams were top, with the A6 team narrowly missing a position in the final four. The A3's met a strong Westminster side in the preliminary final and really had to earn their win. In the Grand Final against Scotch our boys proved superior and ended the day fitter and stronger. Scores 10.15 to 10.5."

Ian Ide captain, and Bill Lodge vice-captain, are to be commended for their fine leadership throughout the season, and Gary Hugo's fine performance at full forward with 94 goals in 14 matches before he left for overseas deserves special mention. Fortunately the vacancy was filled by Ian Haines, whose uncanny marking and accurate kicking was a thrill to watch.

The B's won against Kilburn in the preliminary final, but almost had to be bludgeoned into making a game of it against the same team two weeks later. Fortunately however, they saved their souls from the wrath of Leighton Williams and performed creditably in the second half to win by two points 6.8 v. 6.6.

The two premierships must certainly be attributed to coach

Leighton for the ground work, time, and perserverance he put into the club during that period.

The energetic captain of the B's, Peter Dunn, deserves a special mention for his enthusiasm and keenness on and off the field which quite often must have encouraged his side to victory.

Tony Dalwood also is to be congratulated for being the best and fairest footballer in A3 reserve and winning the Wilson Medal.

The C side was a contender for the final four, but the selection committee was put in the awkward position of having to rotate players. This met with mixed success under the leadership of captain Trevor King, vocal opinions of Vern Drew, Colin Dunsford, and 'Harry the Horse' Perks (A6 medal the following year).

The trophies were awarded to **Best and Fairest:** A's Gary Hugo, B's Tony Dalwood, C's Brenton Perks. **Most Consistent:** A's John Rogers, B's Dean Reichstein, C's Allen Letcher. **Best Team Man:** A's David Cubitt, B's Nick Williams, C's Peter Freburg. **Most Improved Player:** Gordon Hoad.
