## **1972 Premiership- As detailed in the Booklet “History of The Prince Alfred Old Collegian’s Football Club”**

The A’s were a different matter, I knew psychology would be the order so I had a plan at half time. I purposely ordered everybody out of the dressing rooms, including Head, Council members (including the author. Ed.) and well wishing mates and club members. This had never been done before, but this sort of shock treatment certainly brought the players to the alert, so that they were mentally refreshed from the shock for the hard last half.

I guess that day I just broke down from sheer ecstasy and my feeling for the two teams could never be put into words.”

In the course of this history, from time to time prominence has been given to individual players in order to stress a point. Waldeck, Stephens, Dawkins, Ward, Johnston, Dunsford, Brinsley, Johnson, Webb, Fricker, Norman — What a team of club benefactors!! and there will be no opportunity better than now to add the name of Williams to that illustrious list.

Leighton left school in 1943, and after serving in the air force, played football for Stirling in the Hills Association where he was fortunate enough to come under the coaching of Jack Oatey. Quote — “I was coached by the greatest exponent of football, Jack Oatey, who set the basis for my whole outlook on football. He wanted me to come to Adelaide and play half back flank for Norwood in 1948, but because all my friends and families friends were in the Old Scholars I decided to try my luck there. This would be the one thing I have never regretted. The finances of the club at that time varied from 10 to 50 pounds in credit, there was a ‘win’ atmosphere, also a social atmosphere. I shan’t forget that I felt I had a big part in the coaching in ’51 and again in ’72 twenty years later, basically on the Oatey approach of treating every player differently and also trying to gain that extra bit out of tired

players.”

“In the early days, and in fact well into the sixties, it was not unusual when playing for the lower grade teams to play in the second match of the day so as to fill a full team. The thrill later of playing full back and your ruckman calling out “kick it to me Dad, along with your younger son putting in years as boundary umpire — my wife, most, most ardent supporter — my whole family were brought up and bred on the football club.”



“What a wonderful way of life it’s been to bring my family up in this environment — the thrill every year of the Old Scholars’ Week playing and meeting with famous footballers and every match like a replay of the Intercols.”

“There are a million happy memories. I finished up playing 353 games and never had any regrets. How can you recall all the grand players, and now life long friends — ‘Buckets’ Morris, ‘Dasher’ Dalwood, ‘Mog’ Phillips, ‘Chud’ Dewar, ‘Boxer’ Price, Peter Turnbull, my best team man Bill Johnson, a great club man ‘Teddy’ Norman, ‘Chook’ O’Connor, Mick Walsh, ‘Nipper’ Hockney, Colin Webb — gosh there are so many — that’s only half the list.”

Stepping stone to life!! — the club’s **purpose** in real terms. On the right wave length?

Before finally lowering the curtain over the 1972 season, from the widest point of view the best in the club’s history, two associated features should be brought into account.

The first is the introduction in that particular year of the centre square, a move designed to combat the crippling congestion creeping into the play. With the new lay-out restrictions, the Old Reds double barrel premiership may be passed off as a coincidence, or on the other hand as an alteration suiting our brand of play.
