Clearly our best performance for the season over 4 quarters. It is amazing what a win can do for the confidence of the individual and the collective. For the first time this year the A grade were able to consistently finish their work which enabled the team to sustain effort and energy around the ball. The game was won in the first term with a 6 goal to 2 points dominant performance with contributions from all parts of the ground. Our backline looked controlled and composed for most of the afternoon and the constant pressure from our midfield restricted the oppositions time and space. In previous weeks we have struggled to find avenues to goal, amazingly we had 12 different goal kickers on the weekend. The challenge is to continue the momentum as we look for three wins on the trot for the first time this season.

## **1980 Premiership - As detailed in the Booklet "History of The Prince Alfred Old Collegian's Football Club"**

**This week we look back on the 1980 Premiership which was the start of a revival for the Reds as they pushed to A1.**

There is no more appropriate way to open an inquest into the 1980 season than to copy the words and note the actions of Rob Brinsley who was elected captain of the A's in that year — here are his words:—"I think in retrospect that many of us knew that 1980 would be our year, and a group of us, Dean Noblett, Tony Ricketts, Tim Hall and several others started training once a week in November with that conviction within us. David Marsh was appointed coach, and I believe that with the building Max (Thompson) had done and David's incredibly magnetic personality and knowledge of the game, the ingredients were laid for a very successful few years." And as they say in the vernacular — how right he was! 1980 did turn out to be a premiership year after an eight year drought.

A premiership year always is an exciting one, because when it becomes apparent that you are in with a chance, certain 'needle' games assume the proportions of high quality drama. Here are two examples:—End of round 6 — P.A.O.C. and St. Michael's both undefeated — match on their ground — not more than a goal in it all day — minutes to go, the Old Reds down — a goal — three points in front — Don Stephens dominated a succession of boundary throw ins — the siren — celebration at 245 unforgettable.

The other, as readers knowing anything about the Old Reds might guess — the match after the Old Scholars' Dinner on the last Friday in July. This time against a side near the bottom of the table. Whole side played poorly — in danger of defeat all day — late in the last quarter Simon Chapman back on the field after injury snaps an incredible left foot goal — the side lifts — rejuvenation and a win. Rob Brinsley's evaluation:—"It may well have been the kick that put us into A2 for we held second spot and went on to beat St. Michael's by about seven goals in the semi-final at Seaton. We had many good players in that semi-final — Don Stephens, Bill McKenna and Steve Farrell were brilliant and it was an ecstatic feeling to know we were finally in A2 after battling all those years."

Almost belatedly Rob goes on to say:—"Winning the grand final after that was fantastic — the icing on the cake."

Before such a happy conclusion could be reached, many often overlooked items of administration were essential if the equation — players + social + administration = a club is to be satisfied. Obviously the players carried out their part of the contract, were the back-up supporting factors as good? Administration. As had been pointed out, the President of the Old Scholars' Association automatically becomes president of the football club, and the best of Hollywood producers could not have cast a better man for the job than Brian Francis. With ample personal enthusiasm and three sons of more than average ability in the supporting player area they presented a family picture, leaving the missing segment to wife and mother Jan, who seldom misses a match.

D. Wilkinson took over from John Leak as secretary, Tony Buttery continued as treasurer, John Stephens was prepared to play his 31st game as hon. auditor, and chairman of the College Council, Bob Piper was elected to serve as honorary solicitor for yet another year. Robert McBride, Paul Wakefield and Rob. West retired from the social committee, were thanked for their efforts, and were replaced by M. Wilkinson, P. McKenna, D. Hughes and D. Williamson.

The executive committee for the revival year included:—Rob Brinsley, Trevor Dunsford, John Leak, Peter Brinsley (who also was manager of 245, one of the most exacting appointments in the line of duty), Mark Dahlenburg his deputy at 245, and Brian Hockney.

Every appointment in a smoothly running club is important, but none more so than that of coach. Over the years the Old Reds have been blessed with a most acceptable series, each with his own ideas and personality. As has been pointed out however, a new outlook was developing and whether it was based on necessity or the need to 'lift the ante' in order to gain the services of a good coach, or whether all avenues to find an altruistic amateur coach for amateur football had been exhausted, it now matters little, as David Marsh was appointed to the position, and an excellent choice it turned out to be.
