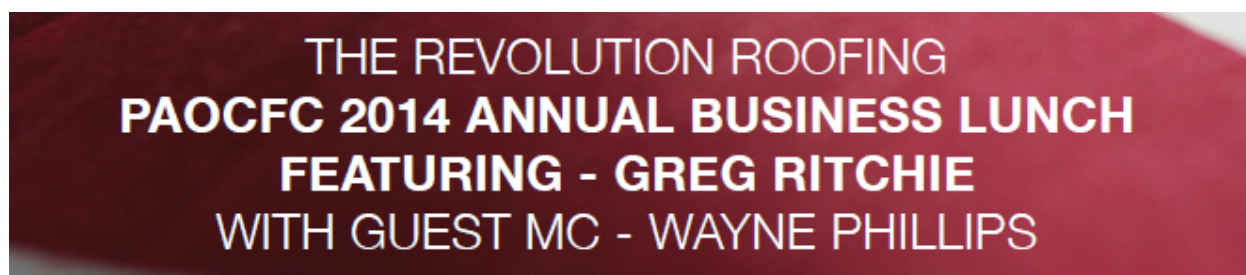

Our first quarter was our most dominant as we strangled SHOC with our pressure, ran hard from the back half and had several options up forward. A 5 goal to 2 first term was a pleasing result given that we have generally started quite slow this year. A few skill errors and our inability to keep the ball inside our fwd 50 enabled SHOC to get back in the game in the second term. The momentum shifted in the game and we went into the long change trailing by 2 points. After narrowing the focus we were able to get back on track in the third and should have been further in front kicking 4.5 to 3.2. Our use of the ball was improving and our ability to mark the ball in dangerous areas of the forward line was a highlight. We ran out the game giving several players good game time and kicking 2.2 to take the victory by 12 points.


