Scotch wasted a few chances themselves early but managed to pressure the scoreboard kicking 4.3 to our 2 points. Our clearance work and ball use was a highlight of the second quarter lead by J.Dalwood, Hugo and J.Graetz as was the ability of D.Reed to hit the scoreboard kicking 4 majors as we piled on 6.3 to head into the long break leading by 11 points. Our ability to hold onto the footy and not enable Scotch easy scoring opportunities was imperative in the third quarter however they managed to skip away kicking 5.3 which would be a telling result come the end of the game. Morale was good as we headed into the last trailing by 15 points. We were breaking even at stoppage and had even contributions from all lines. The final result could have gone either way with both sides having good opportunities to kick clear.
