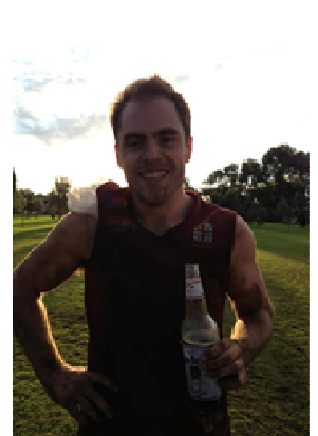

Josh Harkness was single minded in his defensive work down back. Lachie Bartlett, despite a massive hangover, contributed off half back and on the ball and Justin Mitchell was one of the few players to show some clean skills. Charlie Olsson spent a lot more time in the midfield and despite running on empty at the end kept winning contests to drive us forward. Will Farminer won his position strongly at CHB and is continuing to develop and beginning to own this role. James Hill again kept running, tackling and getting the ball all around the ground. It was good to have Will Wood back from a long injury layoff and there continues to be positive signs from the rest of the playing group.

To progress forward we need to get on the training track each week. We need to continually work on the basics of delivery by both hand and foot. We are dominating play for long periods and are winning more of the ball nearly every week against the older and bigger opposition. In the end it is a lack of efficiency of ball movement and not putting the ball to the advantage of your team mates that we need to get right.
