COACH'S REPORT:

The sloppy conditions that presented themselves at the PAC front oval for the early game meant that our work at ground level was going to be crucial to securing a win against our mid-table opponent.

In the first half our intensity was decent but we let ourselves down with some overuse by hand and an inability to consistently string possessions together. Our attacking and defensive structures were OK, but they were a little frail at times as a result of which Salisbury North was able to get the ball through our back lines and score on a few occasions.

However, we addressed this at half time and our skills and general set-up appeared to tighten. We were able to move the ball faster into our forward 50 where 2 to 3 "one-on-one" contests were created - which meant that we were able to hit the scoreboard more often.

Salisbury were able to use the 'spot-up' kick in the first half but better structure with better zone movement from us slowed both them and their scoring down. All in all it was a good win against a keen side in conditions that, until now, had been a bit foreign to us.
