

Our biggest challenge to date awaited us Saturday against fellow undefeated team SHOC. But with Tom Ashby and George Choimes returning from injury and Jack Latchford, Ryan Winter, Fraser Ellis and Mick Phillips promoted from the C's we fielded a strong line up across the ground.

The first half was a low scoring affair with both teams entering the long break 3 goals apiece. We controlled the general tempo of the game, won plenty of contested possession and applied great pressure to SHOC when they had the ball. However our delivery to the forward line was poor. Too often bombing long to contests and allowing SHOC to easily mop up and run the ball back the other way.




