

JOHN ROBERT WALTHAM - 200TH GAME

In the E's Qualifying Final this Saturday, Johno will play his 200th game for the Old Reds. He becomes the 43rd player to reach this milestone. His 14 seasons have spanned 19 years. His career began in 1996 while in Year 11 at PAC. After leaving PAC, he resumed playing in 1998 until work commitments took over in 2005. In 2007 he was recruited to play at Scotch OC, but returned to the Reds in 2008. He hung up the boots in 2013, however with the addition of the E Grade, he was coaxed out to play once more as a regular fill-in. In round 1, he along with Mark McGregor and Tyson Smith, became the first Old Reds to play in 5 grades at the Club. This is not his only unique achievement, as along with his three older brothers; Thomas, David and Andrew, in season 2000 while Dave was back from interstate all four brothers, AKA the "Cheese Platter", lined up in the A's. The Waltham brothers have played over 500 games (168 Pando, 75 Dave & 71 King) for the Club, second to the Sanders brother's record of 754 games. Off the field Johno has been a strong supporter of the Club as a sponsor via his various pubs, the Astor, Seven Stars in the past and more recently the Cumby and the Gallery on Waymouth.

Johno will be the first to tell you that his sole aim in playing football is to kick as many goals as possible and he won't hesitate to add that he never handballs. That said, when claiming he had given off a handball during a game this season, none of his team mates would believe him, until Cam Lynch backed him up saying "Two players came to him and he had absolutely no choice but to handball to me. I walked into an open goal. He was very reluctant. Was also disappointed after that he had to dish it off." In light of that revelation, where does Johno sit in relation to Club goal kicking records?

Club Goal Records

Whilst there aren't many details about Club goal kicking totals, the following are some of the larger tallies on record;

- 100+ Arthur Dawkins, 1937, A Grade, A1 (second to the grade's Leading Goalkicker who kicked 105)
- 119 Arthur Dawkins, 1940, A Grade, A2 Leading Goalkicker (excludes the Semi Final)
- 93 Garry Hugo, 1972, A Grade, A3 (total after 13 games prior to going overseas)
- 86 Rick Phillips, 1978, A Grade, A3
- 100+ Anthony Thompson, 1994, C & D Grade, A8 & A8 Reserves
- 110 Anthony Thompson, 1995, C & D Grade, A6 South & A6SR (played 2 games amny weeks)
- 103 John Waltham, 2001, A Grade, Division 3 (kicked 8 in the Elimination Final to get to 101)

- 23 David "Burra" Reed, 2003, A Grade, Division 3 (the lowest Club total on record!)
- 105 John Waltham, 2004, A Grade, Division 3 (kicked his 100th at Norwood Oval during the finals)
- 95 Nick Brooks, 2013, B, C & D Grade, D2R, A8 & A8R (including finals)


One Thousand!?


Has any player kicked 1000 career goals for the Old Reds? There is no mention in Merv Evans' Club history book (1926-1984) of any long term prolific goal kickers. Unless Johno can dig out some old trophies or past Club records come to light, we may never know if this milestone has been achieved or is within reach. However, if one was to extrapolate the 499 goals that are on record from 106 of the games he played over 7 seasons, then he must be around 936 goals for the Old Reds. If you include the 38 goals he kicked from his 14 games at Scotch, then he may be very close to 1000 SAAFL goals. Either way, a bit more research needs to be done in that area before any claim is made.
