At that point we began to turn the game back in our favour. We got first hands on the ball and began to use it efficiently with our forwards looking threatening when we went inside 50. By half time, despite being outplayed for most of the half, we had pegged the deficit back to 8 points.

The message at half time was not to panic & stick to playing our game. You could sense the confidence among the group rising and to the players credit they put the average first half performance behind them and came out firing in the third quarter. Tromans moved to a wing and provided instant spark with back to back clearances as the dangerous Moroney and Fry goaled within the first 3 minutes of the quarter. From here we started to play the brand of footy that has provided so much success throughout the year. Defensively we strangled PNU. Our pressure across the ground was back on standard as we consistently forced the opposition into turnovers. A big mark & goal from Teague late in the quarter gave us a 7 point advantage heading into the final break.



Our start in the final quarter mimicked the third when Moroney goaled early. We were now running on top of the ground as PNU began to tire. Hard running from our midfielders allowed us to snuff out any comeback and a couple of late goals were the icing on the cake as we completed our perfect season.
