We knew the importance of the first goal of the third quarter and we got this quickly. We started to dominate the centre clearances and quick entry into our forwards saw us add 2 more goals within the first 5 minutes of the term. Our defensive efforts across the ground were excellent throughout the quarter limiting Scotch's ability to move the ball freely forward.

We increased our effort in the first 10 minuted of the final term. Pushing up the hill we kicked the first 2 goals of the quarter to kill the contest. From that time on we limited Scotch's opportunities and left with a 52 point victory.
