Nursing a couple of broken fingers, the skipper's leadership was really noticeable in the second half. Scott Snodgrass and Nate Siebel were their reliable selves, while Henry Basedow and Will Thredgold were dangerous on the wing, covering plenty of territory and using the ball well. Sam Johnston was our best, outstanding in the midfield, and later up forward. Johnno is very coachable, he listens to and follows instructions, works hard defensively chasing and tackling, and has a good sense of where the goals are.

A solid win, but still lacking a consistent four quarter effort which we are confident will come next Saturday against Unley. It's been another good year for the C-grade, but the real work starts now.
