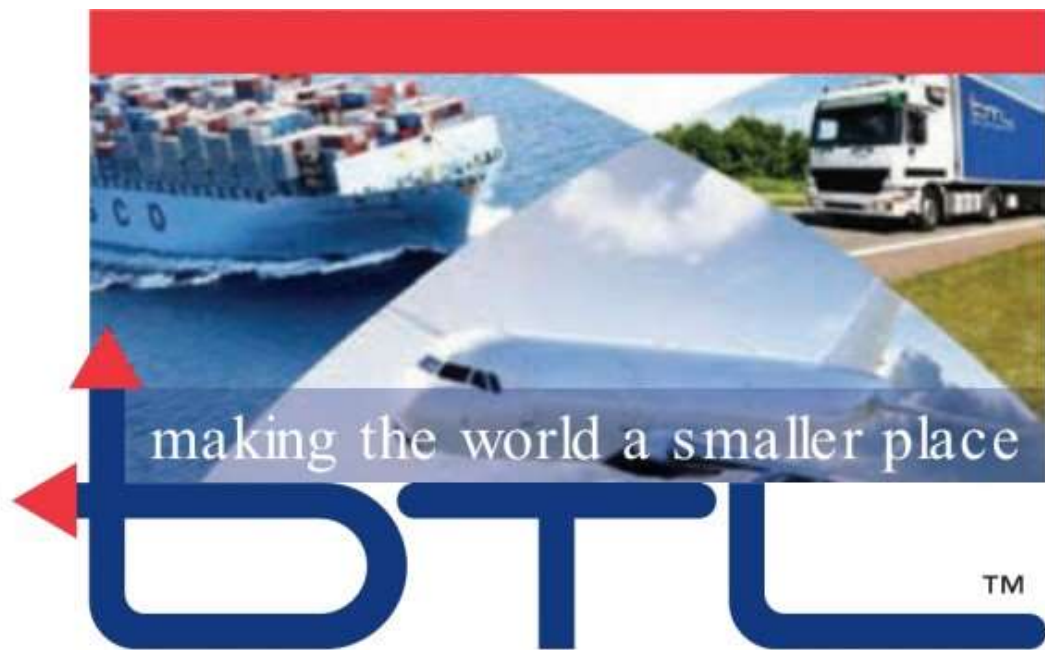

NICHOLAS CHARLES GEORGE PEMBERTON – 200TH GAME

This Saturday sees Nick play his 200th game for the Old Reds, becoming the 45th player to reach this milestone. He is celebrating the milestone by hiring a bus to ferry some of his team mates and loyal supporters to Salisbury Downs Oval. The Club's newest sponsor, The Caledonian has got on-board donating a few cartons of Cooper's finest for the trip back. It seems Nick likes a good bus trip, being one of the solid performers on the 2008 end of season road-trip to Robe, which by coincidence included a long session at the Cally. Nick has always been proactive on the social side, whether it be helping run social events, like Rock with the Reds or organising the Élite mugs last season.

I fondly recall Nick's first game at the Club, when he lined up in the other back pocket in the C Grade in Round 4. Hayden "Sturt" Spears and David "Chappy" Chapman were the coaching team that season and despite the Club still being unable to this day to assign all the game stats correctly for that season, some limited records survive. Each week they recorded some basic info in a spread sheet. Below is a copy of their summary from this particular game.

In Spears & Chapman's Round 9 summary, whilst still listed as starting in the Back Pocket, the report stated "good up forward 2 goals" and for the finals squad summary, he was listed as being Back Pocket / Half Forward. From this first season Nick's career closely followed the Coaching career of David Walker, from his first B Grade game late in 2005, to a full season of B's in 2006 and reaching his peak in 2007 in the A Grade.

Nick's sole premiership came the next season in the B's, yet many of his fellow 2004 Alumni (George Choimes, Daniel Fry, Tyson Smith, Mark McGregor, Nicholas Rees all with 3) can boast multiple premierships during the "Siciliano Era". It seems since 2008 Nick has either:

- hopped aboard the wrong juggernaut – 2011 B's 6th, 2012 B's 5th & 2013 B's 5th;
- choked at the final hurdle – lost grand finals in 2010 B's, 2014 E's & 2015 E's; or
- left his team mates in the lurch – going overseas in Round 15 2009 B's & Prelim Final 2016 E's
