COACH'S REPORT:

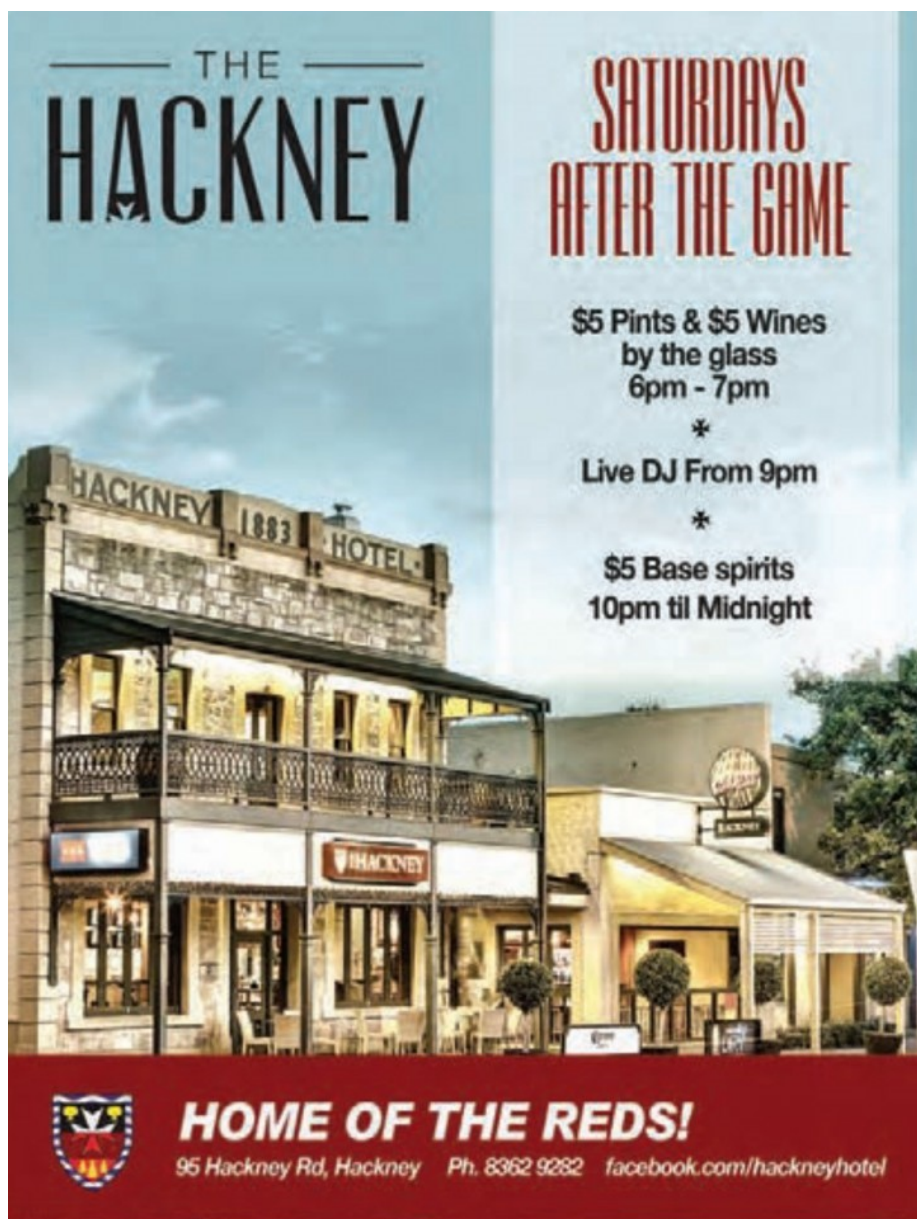
